A Thought From Mark...

If fully lived out, even one verse of Scripture can make an incredible difference amongst God's people. We began last week in this space considering a powerful example of this - 1 Corinthians 15:58...

"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

We noted last week that based on the first word of the verse ("Therefore"), all of chapter 15 is tied to the great imperatives of verse 58. Everything Paul calls for here in the last verse of the chapter is based on the truths and the power of the resurrection of Jesus and His followers.

The next phrase of the verse – "my beloved brothers" - sets the tone for the instruction which follows. Paul in the balance of the verse is going to issue four clear imperatives - commands! These then are nonnegotiables for Christians – they are clearly expected. not simply suggested. But before the apostle issues his directives, he begins with their relationship.

They are not just brethren to be bossed around they are "beloved brethren." Paul loves these people. Does he have some clear commands for them? Absolutely. But they are stated in a context of deep love. Corinth would respond because they knew Paul loved them, and they were learning that God in Christ loved them, and they were figuring out how to love one another.

Sometimes leaders among God's people have to be clear. Not everything is grey – sometimes Scripture says it is black and white. Often we have a clear command from the Lord on an issue, and when we do, it is our place only to proclaim it, and teach it, and call on the people of God to obey it.

But always – ALWAYS! – it is to be done in a context of love. If we cannot address one another as "my beloved brothers / sisters" then we have a big problem. We cannot say we love God while at the same time despising our brethren (1 John 4:20).

So before we consider the four important commands that follow, let us remember the tone in which they are issued: love of the brethren! May we follow and do likewise.


