

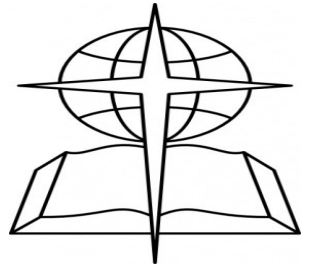

What Can You Give At This Time Of The Year?



At this time of year when we are thinking about giving and receiving gifts, it is a very good time for us to stop and think of the gifts [talents] God has given us and be sure we are using them to glorify Him.

Let's think of the following thoughts:

- If you have a warm handclasp, use it!
- Tell a brother or sister in Christ you love them and appreciate them.
- If you have a hospitable home, share it and use it to influence others to Christ.
