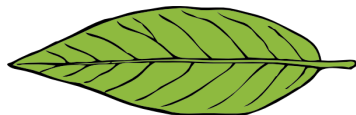
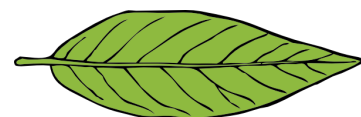

95 Years of Service

Greetings from Bucharest

Our first week in Romania has gone well. Our flight from Charlotte to D. C. was an hour and a half late so we had to run to our next flight. We got to the gates as the doors were closing. But after getting seated, the captain announced that there was an electrical problem with the plane and repairs would be made. After sitting in the plane for two hours, it was decided that the repairs would take too long so we went back into the terminal to change planes. When the plane arrived, it had to be cleaned, and all the luggage had to be moved from the first plane which took another hour. Unfortunately, we arrived in Munich, Germany after our flight had already taken off. United had called ahead and already booked us on the next flight four hours later. We arrived in Bucharest 8 hours later than we were scheduled to arrive, but at least our luggage arrived with us.

We have a very nice apartment, a 10-minute walk to the Metro (the subway). It has been completely remodeled for the son of the lady from whom we rented it. We have WIFI, and even learned that Sprint gives us free text messages in the US and anywhere in Europe.

Our stay in Bucharest has been much peaceful. We spent Friday with the missionary, Albert Cook, his wife, Lavinia, and their family discussing the work in Bucharest. Saturday we watched several junior high volleyball games with their family. Sunday I shared two of the lessons on Community that I have shared with you. Bible study and worship in Bucharest always lasts at least three hours.

After lunch and some errands with church folks, we went to a nature preserve which is only about a 10-minute walk from the church building. We did not even realize it was there. Lavinia called it Bucharest's best kept secret.

Arrangements were made for Ginny and me to study each day with a lady and her husband who is a doctor and two other men. All are not Christians but have been infrequently attending worship. Our studies are going well.

We have been discussing plans to bring students again next summer to teach English using the Bible with the World English Institute's material. They will also conduct a vacation Bible school on the two Saturdays we are present.

Thursday we will have dinner with a lady who has been attending worship ever since we started studying with her probably 10 years ago. Our mid-week Bible study this week will be on Friday. I will be sharing another lesson on Community with the church. Next Sunday I will share two more lessons on Community with them. A week from today we will head home, and we will look forward to being with you again for Bible study a week from Wednesday.

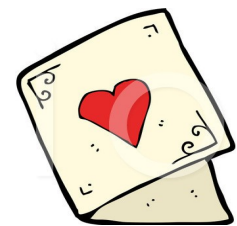
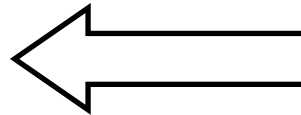
- Dale Dotson passed away Tuesday evening. Funeral was held Friday.

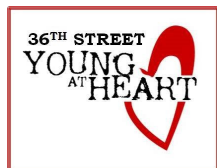
