New beginnings often give us a sense of hope and joy. Newly married couples radiate happiness on their wedding day. Choosing a new place to live beginning a new work is often an exciting adventure.

There's a certain energy that accompanies the start of a new school year. When I was in elementary school, new shoes, new jeans, crayons, pencils. When our children were young, we take them to pick out their new backpacks, school supplies, clothes, and shoes for school. We would spend days store hopping to buy what we needed. We would be armed and ready for whatever the new school year would bring. With college students, to school supplies have been added dorm

room furnishings, car insurance, and college textbooks. For faculty members, the new year means syllabi, seating charts, learning the names of new students and enjoying the renewal of time with returning students.

In a very real way after our experience with COVID-19, we are always experiencing a new beginning. Behold, I will do something new, Now it will spring forth; Will you not be aware of it? I will even make a roadway in the wilderness, Rivers in the desert." He told them to stop dwelling on their punishment, the bad things happening in their Babylonian. They needed to remember His display of power through their exodus from Egypt. He wanted their attention to be focused on the new beginning He would give them by bringing them home from Babylon through a new exodus.

We must hold on to our heritage, what we have been and what must continue to be what God has called the 36th Street Church of Christ to be.

Most of you filled out a "Willing Worker" sheet perhaps years ago indicating the kind of work you would be willing to do for the kingdom. As a part of our new start, we are now going to ask each of you to fill our another one this week.
