Made Like His Brothers: by Doug Kashorek

"Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people" Hebrews 2:17.

It's not about candy canes or lights, trees or sleighs, chimneys or flying reindeer. Perhaps many who celebrate Christmas—even among those who reject the secular trappings that the season has brought and emphasize the birth of Jesus as the Word made flesh—have no idea that this biblical event is really the start of the gospel message. The angel announced the good news of great joy for all the people in a "Savior" that was born.

If Jesus is a Savior, then what is He saving us from? The angel told Joseph the answer: Jesus would be born to "save his people from their sins (Matthew 1:21).

That's an odd thing to say before a baby is born—that His purpose is to die. An odd thing to call Him at His birth—a Savior for all the people. But in all the details of the incarnation—shepherds, a manger, and a star—we forget to ask **why** did a Savior need to be **born**? Couldn't He just have appeared fully formed like a visitor from the Old Testament? No, then He couldn't have died. And without being made like us in every way, He couldn't have been a sufficient sacrifice for our sins.

Jesus had to be fully God to be our Savior, but He had to become fully man to be our sacrifice. *"Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself partook of the same things that through death"*

We were all dead in our sins and couldn't offer propitiation or satisfaction for them. So, the Word became flesh and was made guilty for our offenses to be our sacrifice to God.
