A Widow's Mite: By Michael Moss

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Luke 21:1-4

Luke likes to Jesus account's of reversals: blind people see what others don't and poor people are really rich. In our text Jesus finds himself in the Court of the Women where temple treasury was located. There were 13 trumpet shaped vessels to hold the offerings the people brought.

The story reminds me of a wonderful widow, Sister Mattie, who attended the church where I preached in Nashville, Tennessee. Her only income was a small social security check. Every day she would walk the streets of her neighborhood, as she did she would pick up coins she found. Every year when I would make my mission trip to Romania, she would give me the amount she had collected never more than \$15. In my view, her contribution was more than anyone else.

In our text a widow puts her **two small copper coins** in the collection. She gave 2 lepta (often termed 2 mites) so we talk about the widow's mite. What she gave was perhaps \$2 in today's currency. She had given **all she had to live on** (literally all of her *bios*, her life or her livelihood).

Listen to the words of Jesus: "**Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them. ⁴ For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on.**"

While the other might have contributed large sums and made a big show of their contribution, Jesus said she had given more than all the others. She had trusted God and had given all.

A gift is measured by the spirit with which it is given. There is indeed a great reversal. Those who offer the most may be praised, but they have their reward. The one with little offers most, and she is received.

Today...I will appreciate what God has given me, trust Him, and be a cheerful giver.
