Many Parts, Yet One Body

God prepared me to minister in a small church. As a kid, I helped my great, great aunt down porch steps and into my dad's car to attend mass. I set up tables and chairs for church events, and even took accordion lessons *in front of a crowd!* at the VA Hospital where my dad worked (yes ... I was that cool middle school kid!).

It was the love of God's Word, though, that really prepared me. Eager to read and study (yes ... I was that cool high school kid!), I got my first Bible at age ten and would read into the night by flashlight. So, when I went to college to study English, my biblical literature and public speaking courses were my favorites.

Five years later, I found ministering at a small mission church in the Northeast was like being a jack-of-all-trades in a one-room schoolhouse, but God had given me enough experiences that I was ready for the various challenges over the next 23 years. So, it was a shock when I came to a medium-sized church in July 2021, where there were already four elders, another minister, two interns, and a small handful who were actively doing all the work that I had been doing mostly alone up north.

Just as there was no way that I could do-it-all at 36 th Street with the increased needs of many more people, neither could the apostles in Acts 6 when the number of disciples and their needs increased. Selecting men to do this work, they said, "*we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the Word.*" And though I can lend my experience to assist or advise our leaders and members in many ways, the work must be conducted by others while I minister in the Word. That's how each part of the body works together.

A challenge we have is that we still think as a much larger church. Our numbers smaller, we don't have the luxury of sitting back and expecting others to work. Instead, each unique part must perform its function.
