Loosing the Pangs of Death

About 33 years before, the angel had announced, *"I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."* Christ ... Messiah ... Savior! But Savior from what? Perhaps only Joseph understood what another angel had told him, *"She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus (Savior), for he will save his people from their sins."*

That baby had grown into a great teacher ... and then had died on a cross. But God had raised Him from the dead, and for forty days He had given them convincing proofs that He was indeed alive. His followers would not understand just how wonderful the good news of great joy was until Pentecost when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon them ... and Peter declared that first gospel sermon.

So, what were the words that cut the crowd to the heart and caused 3,000 to repent and be baptized into Jesus that day? What persuaded them to leave the world and be set apart for God? It's an often overlooked and underappreciated phrase in Peter's message that day, a result of the resurrection that was certainly good news of great joy for all of mankind: *loosing the pangs of death.*

We had suffered those pangs since Eden. Romans 5:12 says, *"Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned."* This means that because the Word became flesh and was made like His brothers in every way that He could take our place in death ... so that we could take His place in life.

Not guilty for sin ... but forgiven! No longer separated from God ... but invited behind the curtain of Jesus' body into the presence of God by borrowed righteousness! No longer overcome ... but more than conquers to never have to know the second death—eternal destruction and shut away from our Savior!

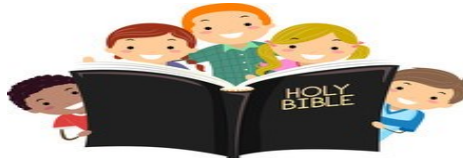
